



TRAC was established as a project sponsored by United Way of Tarrant County and managed by Clayton YES. The mission was to enhance the skills, quality, and success of afterschool staff by providing the school-age care community access to and information about training opportunities and resources.

In 2004 the United Way Kids Way Impact Council, made up of childcare leaders in Tarrant County, identified quality training as one of the biggest challenges facing the afterschool community. In order to meet this challenge and provide new, more accessible, and high quality trainings, United Way sent out a Request for proposals and guaranteed funding for the project that best met the goals laid out by the council.

The United Way grant for TRAC was awarded to Clayton YES in January 2005. Clayton YES provided the website design and maintenance as well as the project management for TRAC, a web accessible database of training resources. The length of the grant was for one year with the possibility of renewal upon further consideration.

Our hope was that over time, TRAC would be seen as not only a source of information on trainings, but also as a forum for community discussion and general information sharing among the members of the Tarrant County afterschool community.

TRAC is currently between funding sources and is looking for new training needs and resources in the Tarrant community of afterschool professionals. Please contact us if you need more information or become a part of the TRAC community of afterschool professionals.
